The combined middle/high school is committed to serving the diverse needs of young students, ages 12 and up, and offers a unique blend of public school education with individual plans of care in a setting conducive to improved academics, improved school behavior, and personal growth.

The WCMS Safe Saw Initiative has been a focus of the organization's ongoing grants program over the past two years. The initiative aimed to reduce the prevalence of table saw accidents by encouraging local high schools to use finger-sensing technology saws in their industrial arts classes, and to teach the importance of safe technology in future employment settings.
